

We Believe...

Believer's Baptism and the Lord's Supper are the only ordinances ordained by God for observance in the Church.

In obedience to our Lord's command and in accordance with the teachings and practices of His apostles, all believers are to follow Jesus in Believer's Baptism. This ordinance outwardly and visibly demonstrates the inward, invisible reality of the believer's new life in Jesus. The baptismal act of immersion symbolizes the believer's identification with Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. Water baptism is the believer's public testimony, wherein s/he professes faith in Jesus Christ before the believing Church and unbelieving world.

Lake Pointe observes as normative the practice of baptism by immersion after the believer's conscious decision to trust Jesus Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. Lake Pointe Church only accepts baptisms, in which the meaning was biblical (i.e., symbolizing the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ) and the timing was biblical (i.e., after conscious conversion through personal faith in Jesus). Lake Pointe Church will accept baptisms, which agree with the biblical meaning and timing, but differ only in mode (i.e., sprinkling, pouring).

In obedience to our Lord's command and in accordance with the teachings and practices of His apostles, all believers are to regularly and reverently observe the Lord's Supper in the unity of the Holy Spirit and the purity of the Word. The elements of the Lord's Table symbolize His broken body and shed blood. As such, believers are to gratefully receive these elements in memorial observance of Jesus' death and resurrection, remembering the accomplished work of His First Advent and reflecting on the anticipated work of His Second Advent.

Lake Pointe Church observes as normative the practice of Holy Communion, in which all true believers in Jesus share together the elements of His Table.

during His First Advent, our Lord Jesus Christ voluntarily left the glories of Heaven, taking upon Himself full and perfect humanity in His Incarnation.

As the perfect God-Man Savior through the Virgin Birth, Jesus unites full Deity and perfect humanity without mixture, change, confusion, or separation in one person forever. Jesus lived a perfect, sinless life, revealing God to sinful humanity. At the cross, Jesus, though innocent, voluntarily endured the shameful death of a criminal, atoning for the sins of all humanity with His substitutionary death and serving as the propitiation for these sins by turning aside the wrath of God. Upon His death, Jesus was buried in an empty tomb, and three days later, He victoriously arose in a physical body, thus conquering sin, Satan, and death. After His resurrection, Jesus ascended into Heaven, where He now sits in exaltation at the right hand of God the Father.

God created humans, both male and female, in His perfect image.

Through their moral fall in the Garden of Eden, however, Adam and Eve plunged themselves and the entire human race into sin, which is rebellion against God and the moral transgression of His holy character and righteous standard. As the head of all humanity, Adam incurred death, which is separation from God, upon himself and all his posterity in the human race. Thus, all humans are born totally depraved, being sinners by nature and deed and incurring guilt before a holy God.

We Believe...

the Holy Spirit permanently indwells all believers, fulfilling His regenerating work of the new birth unto eternal life.

Moreover, the Holy Spirit baptizes all believers at the moment of their salvation into the Body of Christ, His Church, sealing them forever secure until the day of their glorification in Christ. Until the consummation of their salvation, the Holy Spirit ministers to all believers through intercessory prayer, conviction of sin, motivation toward holiness, illumination of the Word, and empowerment for ministry. The Holy Spirit also bestows spiritual gifts to all believers at the moment of their salvation to be used for the edification of the Church and the evangelization of the world. The manifestation of the various spiritual gifts is the sovereign prerogative of the Holy Spirit, as He wills different gifts to the Church at different times. Like the spiritual gift of apostleship, which appears to have been limited to the Apostolic Era, the Holy Spirit may choose to limit specific, "sign" gifts to distinct periods of time, such as before the canonization of the New Testament.
